Summer meals will be provided to all children ages 18 years and under without charge. Acceptance and participation requirements for the Program are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. Parents or guardians do not need to apply to get free summer meals for their children. They can simply bring their child to the safe summer meal site(s). There will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service.

Please Note! Per Maryland State Department of Education guidelines:

- All summer meals must be eaten on site, with the exception of fresh fruit and prepackaged items.
- Parents/guardians will not be allowed to collect meals to go for their children.
- Children must be present to receive summer meals.

The days/hours of operation and start/end dates may vary, based on participation levels.
