The state's human service provider



The Maryland Department of Human Services is the state's human service provider. The agency provides a wide range of services that are administered by local departments of social services in each of the 24 local jurisdictions across the state. These services assist low-income individuals and families in their communities. They include:

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)



Provides low-income households assistance to buy nutritious food.

Child Support Program



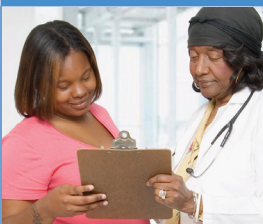
Provides services to families to collect payments, establish paternity and enforce court orders.

Temporary Disability Assistance Program



Provides cash assistance to low-income, disabled Marylanders with no other resources.

Medical Assistance



Provides health benefits for needy families and low-income disabled individuals.

Maryland Energy Assistance Program



Provides services to low-income Marylanders to pay their utility and home heating bills, minimize heating crises, and make energy costs more affordable.

Temporary Cash Assistance



Provides cash to families with children and prepares program participants for employment.

Emergency Assistance to Families with Children



Provides cash assistance to families who need immediate help paying rent, utilities, or other emergency bills.
