SCHOOL TARGETS AND STRATEGIES

LITERACY

All students (1-5) will have an overall 4% increase on the 2018 Winter Reading MAP assessment from baseline performance , Spring 2017 of 40%% to target performance, Winter, 2018 of 44%.

Strategies

- 1. In order to impact language arts instruction, staff will receive monthly professional development from the RST on ways to differentiate instruction and tasks based on strategy grouping, guided reading instruction, differentiated centers and IDR.
- 2. Staff will engage in data conversations using The Next Step Forward in Guided Reading by Jan Richardson. The RST will move staff through the Assess, Decide, Guide framework for supporting every reader as a resource.
- 3. In order to impact reading instruction, staff will personalize learning through student goal setting. Staff will guide students through creating MAP reading goals based on the Spring 2017 MAP data. Students will be able to identify strategies need to achieve goals.

MATHEMATICS

All students will have an overall 4% increase on the 2018 Winter Math MAP assessment from baseline performance, Spring 2017 of 39.2% to target performance, Winter, 2018 of 43.2%.

Strategies

- 1. In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will receive monthly professional development from the MST on the collection and analysis of formative assessment(Formative 5 Assessment) including observation, interviews, questioning, and exit tasks in order to determine instructional needs of students and to inform and differentiate instruction.
- 2. In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will engage in data conversations with the MST to analyze the data collected from the tools used in the monthly PD sessions. Staff will then make instructional adjustments based on strengths and needs of students.
- 3. In order to impact mathematics instruction, staff will personalize learning through student goal setting. Staff will guide students through creating MAP math goals based on the Spring 2017 MAP data. Students will be able to identify strategies need to achieve goals.
